PAINTING BETWEEN THE TIDES: WALTER LANGLEY (1852-1922) 25 MAY – I OCTOBER 2022



We are delighted that the major new exhibition, *Painting Between* the Tides: Walter Langley (1852-1922) is now open. Incorporating more than 60 paintings, the exhibition is an overview of Langley's entire career and includes large scale watercolours as well as oils produced for Royal Academy shows.

We are thrilled that the exhibition showcases a large oil painting from 1897 entitled In Faith and Hope the World Will Disagree but All Mankind's Concern is Charity. The work hasn't been displayed publicly in the UK for more than 30 years and has travelled all the way from Texas for the show. The exhibition also features Langley's monumental oil painting of 1896, *Breadwinners*. Recently restored, the work is being shown alongside Penlee House's watercolour version for the very first time.

In 1881, Birmingham born Langley received a commission from a wealthy patron to spend the following year in Newlyn, documenting the lives of the fisherfolk. Coming from a poor, working-class background himself, Langley was particularly touched by the hardship faced by the fishing community and his paintings are filled with tales of tragedy, loss and hope.

Walter Langley is known as the

'pioneer of the Newlyn School', as he was the first of the Newlyn School artists to settle in the village, setting up his studio in 1882. Like many of his fellow Newlyn artists, he had spent time painting in Brittany and Holland before settling in Cornwall.

Although Langley was an accomplished painter in oils, he mainly worked in watercolour, often on a large scale. This method of working rewarded his meticulous attention to detail, which was partly a result of him being a trained lithographer. Using this demanding and difficult medium, he portrayed scenes of everyday life in a small fishing village, highlighting the hardships and tragedies that were commonplace during that period.

Painting Between the Tides:Walter Langley (1852-1922) will be on display until 1 October 2022.

Penzance Council is looking for up to three advisors who would be willing to give their time and expertise to sit on the Council's Penlee Committee in a voluntary capacity to help Penlee House achieve its vision, mission and values.

As the role is an advisory one, you will have no voting rights on the Committee, however, your advice will be very welcomed.



Showcasing some of the earliest works to form the collection as well as more recent additions, the exhibition featured popular paintings such as Eyes and No Eyes by Frank Bramley and The Pied Piper by Elizabeth Forbes, alongside lesser-known acquisitions, such as small Cryséde purse.

INTERNATIONAL LOAN TAKES BRYAN PEARCE TO THE NETHERLANDS

Bryan Pearce's Penzance Harbour (all round) (1963), which has graced the walls of Penlee's Social History Gallery for so long, has been loaned to Museum Belvédère in the Northern Netherlands for an exhibition exploring the artistic colony of Modernist St lves and its relation to the surrounding landscape.

Living the Landscape: Barbara Hepworth, Ben Nicholson and the artists of St. Ives 1939-1975 hopes to draw parallels between the colony of artists and their distinct artistic practice that grew up in St lves and the colony that developed in the rural Northern Netherlands province of Friesland, arguing that both were heavily influenced by their environment.

Feico Hoekstra, one of the exhibition's curators, says that "at a time when landscape is being reduced to statistics by policymakers, Museum Belvédère hopes with Living the Landscape to contribute to the realisation that a landscape is not the sum of clouds, grass and trees, but a living environment of which people are part. Whoever touches the landscape touches the people."

Bryan Pearce (1929–2007) was born and lived all his life in St Ives. His regular walks around St Ives, have been the inspiration for his subject matter, unconsciously recording the town's subtle changes.

He is recognised as one of the country's foremost 'naïve' painters, through the ongoing re-examination of familiar views and landmarks, Pearce offers us his profound, extraordinary experience of St Ives. He suffered from the then unknown condition phenylketonuria, which affects the normal development of the brain, allowing Pearce to paint the world as he saw it, in a synthesis of imagination and reality.
