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A JOURNEY THROUGH WEST CORNWALL AND THE CORNISH PAINTINGS OF MARTINA THOMAS 27 JANUARY - 20 APRIL 2024

This Spring we are staging two exhibitions to run concurrently. The first is a one-room show of Cornish landscapes by artist Martina Thomas (1924 - 1995). Born in east London, and living most of her life in Sussex, Martina was inspired by her visits to Cornwall with husband Eric Mellon and their children.

Martina was devoted to her faithful Fauve-inspired technique and representation which she observed throughout her life, culminating in paintings with an application of high oil colour using a palette knife.

In celebration of the centenary of the artist's birth and to mark her dedication to painting

the landscapes, harbours and fishermen of Cornwall, Penlee House has worked with Martina's family to curate a selection of her Cornish artworks. The show will include rarely-exhibited examples of her later work alongside works by Martina held in the collections of Penlee House and Falmouth Art Gallery.

To complement this, our second exhibition, Journey through West Cornwall, will depict places such as Marazion, Penzance, Newlyn, Mousehole, Land's End, Sennen, Zennor and St Ives. Featuring urban, rural and coastal landscapes and lesser-known topographical works from the Penlee House collection, we've curated a

selection of watercolours, oils and photographs celebrating the local surroundings.

Penlee House Curator Katie
Herbert said "Martina Thomas
painted throughout her life and
the techniques she used are quite
different in many respects to the
techniques we normally see in the
Newlyn School paintings but her
passion for art and the Cornish
Landscape shines through her
work.

A Journey Through West Cornwall will be an opportunity to show visitors how the local landscape has altered over the past 160 years, or indeed, to what extent things have remained the same and would have been familiar sights all those years ago".

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HILDA QUICK BY RON CLEGG

This wood-block print by the artist, musician, author and noted ornithologist, Hilda Quick is one of a number to be donated to Penlee House. Penzance-born Hilda attended school alongside Norman Garstin's daughter Alethea. Hilda's early academic achievements did not point to her later success as an artist. Instead it seems her early passion was for the musical score rather than the artist's palette.

During the First World War, Hilda played in concerts to raise money for the Red Cross and in 1920 joined the Penzance Orchestral Society as a first violinist, often under their Principal Violinist Lilian Garstin. She remained with this orchestra for some twenty-seven years. In 1921 Hilda enrolled with the then London Central School of Arts and Crafts where she specialised in wood engraving. A short time in Paris was followed by further tuition, this time from Norman Garstin.

As well as producing programmes and costume designs for the emerging Minack Theatre she also embarked on what would absorb her for life: ornithology.

In the years leading up to World War II, she continued with contributions to theatre productions, book illustrations, art exhibitions and orchestral work. Increasingly committed to ornithology she travelled throughout Cornwall cataloguing species and recording them in her woodblock prints. 1948 saw the publication of her first book Marsh and Shore Bird Watching in Cornwall, which she also illustrated.

Following the death of her parents, Hilda moved from Penzance to St Mary's on the Isles of Scilly. Over the years her regular bird-watching trips had drawn her close to the Isles and its peoples. Her second book, *Birds of the Scilly Isles*, was published in 1964.

Hilda died in 1978 at Pringlis Cottage on St Mary's and is buried in the local churchyard. In 1980 an exhibition of her work curated by Newlyn Art Gallery toured Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

Some of Hilda's work is archived at the Morrab Library, Penzance and the Minack Theatre, Porthcurno. An online source is easily accessible through the search facility at University of the Arts London.

ACQUISITIONS

Other recent acquisitions include two watercolour portraits of Thomas Cooper Gotch and Caroline Gotch by William Wainwright, kindly donated by Pep and John Branfield; oil paintings by Louis Grier and Garnet Wolesley (bequests); a watercolour painting by Walter Langley, illustrated letters written by Stanhope Forbes and some copper artefacts made by Francis Cargeeg (all formerly on long-term loan); a photograph album relating to performances at the Pavilion Theatre in the 1950s; three collections of local photographs plus a scale model of an AGA cooker made by Herbert Dyer of Mousehole.

What's my role at Penlee House?

My role at Penlee House is as Visitor Experience and Retail Manager (or the unfortunate acronym VERM). This new role combines responsibility for our retail provision with wider visitor experience responsibilities, including managing lots of building maintenance! Since starting the role I have been developing the shop, looking at potential avenues for new stock and stockists. I am pleased that we are soon to welcome two permanent members of the retail team after a considerable period using temporary staff; with these posts filled, we can really drive the shop forward. In 2024 I will be launching Penlee House's online shop. This will give our less local visitors opportunities to support the Gallery in purchasing products from the shop when they may not be able to visit in person.

What's your background?

I come to Penlee House after 7 years working at Bodmin Keep – Cornwall's Army Museum (formerly Cornwall's Regimental Museum), in visitor experience and collections management roles. Here I learnt and developed skills in retail and visitor services. I made the move to Cornwall for this role, despite no military background, and haven't looked back since. I had previously had roles working with archaeological and social history collections at The Roman Baths, Bath, The Museum of London and Museum of London Archaeology.

What's your favourite object in the collection?

My favourite object is actually a group of objects; the Hayle hoard of 2004 Roman radiate coins, found by metal detectorists and then excavated in Hayle parish in 2016. Roman coin hoards will always hold a special place in my heart, as I worked for a number of years at The Roman Baths, Bath where a considerable amount of my time was spent working with a somewhat larger hoard of around 17500 roman coins. I love thinking about how these hoards come to be buried and what happened to the person who buried it.
